# Etymology

The old interpretation is from  $\dot{\alpha}$ - (a-, "copulative prefix") + the Proto-Indo-European root \* $telh_2$ - of τλῆναι ( $tl\hat{e}nai$ , "to thole, suffer, endure, bear"). But according to Beekes, a Pre-Greek word.
