Maintenance notes

This list includes any Hebrew name that is known to be used as a personal name in any cultural or religious

tradition. This includes but is not limited to all existing traditions used by Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. If the gender of the name is not listed, it is of (as yet) undetermined gender.

Format

For linguistic consistency, as long as a name has an attestable or logical Hebrew form, then Hebrew form in Hebrew alphabetical order is preferred in all cases, even if none of the people who use the name are active speakers of Hebrew.

Standard Hebrew and Tiberian Hebrew

With respect to all varieties of Hebrew and to the different religious and cultural traditions that involve Hebrew, Standard Hebrew and Tiberian Hebrew are preferred for the transliterations of the names. Standard Hebrew is important because it is the modern internationally-standardized form of the language, as well as one of the official languages of the State of Israel. Likewise, Tiberian Hebrew is important because it is one of the oldest attestable forms of the language that specifies specific vowels. An example of how they are different and uniquely useful: the transliteration for עברית is *Ivrit* in Standard Hebrew and *Ibrît* in Tiberian Hebrew.

Omission of redundant variations

Some vowel variations of Biblical names are omitted because of the phonological habits of Tiberian Hebrew. In particular, when a word or name is mentioned with particular emphasis, certain long vowels can change to other vowels. The circumflexed vowels (\hat{a} \hat{a} \hat{e} \hat{e} \hat{i} \hat{o} \hat{u}) tend not to change in this manner. The vowels change in this manner:

- à becomes á
 - á becomes á
 - è becomes á
 - é becomes á
 - ï becomes ê
 - í becomes é
 - ü becomes ó
 - ú becomes ó

Additionally, the hataf vowels (**אֵ אַ אָ**) can be simplified to schwa (**ə**) if they immediately follow a consonant that is not a guttural (**בּ בַּ בָּ נּ נַּ נָּ**).

This list also omits common contractions of names. These common contractions often shorten and simplify a commonly used root component that occurs at the beginning or end of the name. These include:

- At the beginnings of names:
 - אֲבִי 'Ābî ("father; leader") can become אָב 'Ab.
 - אֱלֹהִי 'Ēlî ("my God") can become אֵל 'El. Additionally, אֱלִיyy 'Ēliyy can become אֵלִי 'Ely, but this usually only reflects a difference in the vowels and not the letters of the name.
 - יְהוָה Yəhô (the LORD) can become יְהָ Yô.
 - At the ends of names:
 - יְהֻן yâhû (the LORD) can become יְהָ yâ.

Contractions are not as common if a contracted spelling yields the same sequence of letters as another traditionally different name, such as the difference between 'Elî 'ézer and El 'azâr.

Furthermore, names ending with **שׁ**, where this means "salvation," have traditionally had no fewer than *five* variant vocalizations—**שׁ** ša', **שׁ** ši'a', **שׁ** šē'a', **שׁ** šū'a' and **שׁ** šō'a'. Only the most common form is included on this list, and the other forms with other vowels are to be understood to be possible variations of the name.

Israeli English transcriptions

Israelis often use certain popular transcriptions when they transcribe their names into English. These transcriptions are often simple, spelling in such a way that they do not use characters or diacritics not found in English. Typically, the differences between these transcriptions and Standard Hebrew scientific transliteration are:

- **א Alef** and **ע ayin** are typically transcribed as a simple apostrophe ('), and never at the beginning or ends of names nor before other consonants. But just as often, this apostrophe is not transcribed at all.
- Vowel accents are never transcribed.
- **ו Vava**, scientifically transliterated "ə", is either transcribed "e" or omitted completely. Which one is based on rather subtle (albeit largely regular) habits of Israeli Hebrew pronunciation, e.g. "Kna'an" vs. "Ashkenaz".
- **ז Zere male**, scientifically written "e", is typically transcribed and pronounced "ei". **ז Zere** and **ׁseggol**, both also scientifically transliterated "e", are still transcribed and pronounced "e".
- Where **ׁ yod** comes after a vowel and either before a consonant or at the end of a name, Israelis typically diphthongize it with the preceding vowel, and transcribe it "i", e.g. "Yishai".
- Doubled consonants are usually transcribed single, though both "s" and "ss" are often transcribed "ss" to emphasize that it is not pronounced like English "z". "iyy" is often reduced to "iy" or simply "i", e.g. "Eliyahu" or "Eliahu".
- Where **ׁ yod** occurs between two vowels where the vowel on the right is pronounced "i", the "y" or "yy" is sometimes not transcribed at all, and sometimes an apostrophe is placed instead, e.g. "Haim" (though "Avigayil" can be found too).
- **ח Het** is often transcribed "h", "ch" or "kh" at the beginnings of names or after other consonants, but is typically transcribed "ch" or "kh" everywhere else, e.g. "Heshvan", "Yiftach".
- Soft **ׁ haf** is transcribed "ch" or "kh".
- **ׁ Zade** is typically transcribed "tz" (e.g. "Yitzhak"), though "z" and "ts" can also be found.
- **ׁ Qof** is typically transcribed and pronounced "k".
- **ׁ Šin** is transcribed "sh".

Convention of list items

For clarity, the current convention for list items is:

- **עֲבָרִית Standard**, Tiberian, English, *Israeli English*. "Definition." Gender.

Hebrew names in other languages

If a name of ultimate Hebrew origin exists in another language, but has in some way been modified to reflect circumstances such as a different gender, "pet form", diminutive ("little") state, or hypocoristic (shortened/nickname) state, etc., then the name *probably* does not belong in this list. In most of these cases, the name has become inseparably integrated with the grammar of the host language, and no longer has a distinct Hebrew counterpart. If there are name lists on Wikipedia for the host language, then such a name probably belongs in that particular list.

Shahar is the god of dawn in the pantheon of Ugarit. He is the twin brother and counterpart of Shalim, son of El, and the god of dusk. Both are gods of the planet Venus, and were considered by some to be a twinned avatar of the god Attar (Athtar). As the markers of dawn and dusk, Shahar and Shalim also represented the temporal structure of the day.

Etymology

The name is a cognate of the Hebrew word *Shahar* (שָׁחַר) meaning *dawn*.

Shahar in Isaiah 14:12-15

Isaiah 14:12-15 has been the origin of the belief that Satan was a fallen angel, who could also be referred to as Lucifer. It refers to the rise and disappearance of the morning star Venus in the phrase "O shining one, son of the dawn" (Helel ben Shahar, translated as Lucifer in the Vulgate). This understanding of Isa. 14:12-15 seems to be the accepted interpretation in the New Testament, as well as among early Christians such as Origen, Eusebius, Tertullian, and Gregory the Great. It may be considered a Christian "remythologization" of Isa. 14, as the verse originally used Canaanite mythology to build its imagery of the hubris of a historical ruler, "the king of Babylon" in Isa. 14:4. It's likely that the role of Venus as the morning star was taken by Athtar, in this instance referred to as the

son of Shahar. The reference to Shahar remains enigmatic to scholars, who have a wide range of theories on the mythological framework and sources for the passage in Isaiah.
