Isidore (/ˈɪzədɔːr/, sometimes spelled **Isidor**, **Isadore**, or **Isador**) is a male given name of Greek origin, derived from Ἰσίδωρος, *Isidōros* (a compound of 3 Iσις, *Ísis*, and δῶρον, *dōron*: "gift of [the goddess] Isis").

Similar "gift" names include the Greek "Theodore" ("gift of God"), the Persian "Mithradates" ("gift of Mithras") and Datis ("gift"), and the Hebrew "Matanya" ("gift of YHWH"). The Indo-European "gift" names are ultimately derived from the *PIE root *deh₃-, "to give".

Isidora is the equivalent female given name.
