Jordanian Democratic People's Party (in Arabic: *Hizb Al-Sha'ab Al-Dimuqrati Al-Urduni*, حزب الشعب الديمقراطي, abbreviated HASHD), is a political party in Jordan. HASHD was formed in 1989, when the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine separated their branch in Jordan to become a separate party.

HASHD publishes the weekly newspaper *Al-Ahali*. In the past, the party published the weekly newspaper *al Lajna al Shaabiya*.^[1]
