Maroth (Hebrew, “bitterness”—Maroot, Mar-out)—with another angel Haroth, Maroth was sent down by God “with full commission to exercise government over all mankind, and to tutor and instruct them.” [*Rf.* Heywood, *The Hierarchy of the Blessèd Angels*, p. 289.] Maroth is a character in Eastern lore (Persian) taken over by the Jews. The Koran also speaks of Maroth as an angel.
