

What Does Noeticus Mean?

Noeticus is a term that was developed by consciousness researcher John White to describe the next phase of human development – a phenomenon he called the emergence of *homo noeticus*.

Noeticus comes from the Greek word *noetikos*, the adjective derivative of the term *noesis*, which means understanding, perception, and clear mind.

Grc. νόη- (νόησις) + Grc. suff. -τικός > Grc. νοητικός.
