From Akkadian 𒌦𒀭𒌦𒀭𒌦𒀭 (*Uru-anna*, “heaven's light”).

- (5th BC Attic): IPA: /ɔ̄rɪí,ɔ̄n/
- (1st BC Egyptian): IPA: /o:ri:ɔ:n/
- (4th AD Koine): IPA: /oríon/
- (10th AD Byzantine): IPA: /oríon/
- (15th AD Constantinopolitan): IPA: /oríon/
