

Sabaoth (Tsabaoth, Ibraoth) – "hosts" One of the angels of the presence; one of the divine names in Gnostic and cabalistic lore. In Gnosticism, he is one of the seven archons, creators of the universe.

SABAOTH A Hebrew word meaning “hosts” that has been used over the years to denote the heavenly hosts. In a more personal sense it means an actual angel or, in the Gnostic understanding of the heavenly hierarchy, one of the archons. Sabaoth is also used as a spelling for the angel Sabaoc, who with other angels was removed from official lists by Church officials in 745 as ineligible for veneration by the faithful.
