

This talk was given in December 1982 [NOTE: All quotations are by <u>Terence McKenna</u>.]

"The search for a radio signal from an extraterrestrial source is probably as culture-bound an assumption as to search the galaxy for a good Italian restaurant."

"It is no great accomplishment to hear a voice in the head. The accomplishment is to make sure it is telling you the truth."

"The demons are of many kinds. Some are made of ions, some of mind. The ones of ketamine, you'll find, stutter often and are blind."

"There is no dignity in the universe unless you meet these things [psychedelics] on your feet. And that means that you have an I/thou relationship, and you say ... 'you're long on talk, but what can you show me?"

"These things [psychedelic medicines] invoke the Logos, which means they work directly on the language centers. So that the important aspect of the experience is the dialogue."

"I think if someone tells you they've every drug you know they're confessing they're a dilettante. It's much better to lean hard on a few."

"I think one of the interesting things about judging a drug is to see how eager people are to do it the second time. If they're eager to do it the second time it's probably not worth bothering about, because what is necessary to have validity in these experiences is the terror. The terror is a stamp of validity on the experience, because it means this is real."

"Friends, right here and now, one quanta away, there is raging a universe of active intelligence that is trans human, hyper dimensional, and extremely alien."

"The most alien thing in the cosmos is the human soul."

"As nervous systems evolve to higher and higher levels, they become more and more to understand the true situation in which they are embedded."

"As nervous systems evolve to higher and higher levels they become more and more to understand the true situation in which they are embedded. And the true situation in which we are embedded is an organism, an organization of active intelligence that is on a galactic scale."

"In other words, shamanic experience, drug experience, this is ruled out of bounds. And it is because it is the source of novelty. The cutting edge of the ingression of the novel into the plenum of being is happening there. I mean, think about it for a moment. If the human mind does not loom large in the coming history of the human race, then what is to become of us?"

"So I am saying we are at the beginning of human thought. This is the birth crisis of intelligence. And intelligence is something which is moving through the higher primates now at greater and greater speed."

"The fact is that the densest organizational material in the universe is the human cortex. And the richest experience in the universe is the experience you're having right now."

"The testimony that I want to give today is that magic is alive in hyperspace, and you don't have to believe me or follow me or do anything to validate that except form a relationship with these plant drugs."

"There is some surety that you are dealing with a creature of integrity if you deal with a plant, but the creatures born in the demonic artifice of laboratories have to be dealt with very, very carefully."

"DMT is like an intellectual black hole in that once you know about it, it's very hard for anyone to understand you when you're talking about it."

"The future is bound to be psychedelic because the future belongs to the mind."

"The tragedy of our cultural situation is that we have no shamanic tradition. Shamanism is primarily technique, not ritual."

"The only intellectual, or noetic, or spiritual path worth following seems to me to be the one that builds on your own experience."





This idea has come to the forefront in our time (30 years later!) when we are so concerned about our fragility in the face of nuclear radiation on Earth and cosmic radiation in outer space.

Consider this: shielding spacecraft against radiation is quite unfeasible for long manned journeys. The amount of shielding material required is simply too large to ever be launched into space. Currently, whenever there's extreme solar weather, ISS astronauts are either sitting there receiving strong doses, or they have to descend back to Earth. On very long space journeys you don't have the option of a protective atmosphere & magnetosphere to retreat to.

This implies that for prolongued exodus across Space our species may have to re-engineer itself into a more resilient vessel.

Our body's requirements of temperature range, air, water, food, and not receiving deadly radiation are too much to work around faced with titanic undertakings such as colonizing Space... and even the current climate change on Earth. We're very adaptable creatures they always say, but actually we're adaptable within a Garden-of-Eden-sweet-spot.

A trade-off has to occur between re-engineering ourselves and terraforming new Worlds.

Tryptamine is a monoamine alkaloid found in plants, fungi, and animals. It contains an indole ring structure, and is structurally similar to the amino acid tryptophan, from which it derives its name. Tryptamine is found in trace amounts in the brains of mammals and is believed to play a role as a neuromodulator or neurotransmitter.^[7]

The tryptamine chemical structure is the backbone for a group of compounds termed collectively *tryptamines*. This group includes many biologically active compounds, including neurotransmitters and psychedelic drugs.

The concentration of tryptamine in rat brains is about 3.5 pmol/g.^[8]

Plants containing tryptamine


Many plants contain small amounts of tryptamine, for example, as a possible intermediate in one biosynthetic pathway to the plant hormone indole-3-acetic acid.^[] Higher concentrations can be found in many *Acacia* species.

Role in vertebrates

Tryptamine acts as a serotonin releasing agent^[9] and a serotonergic activity enhancer.^[10] It is metabolised by MAO-A and MAO-B.^[11]

Tryptamine derivatives

Well-known tryptamines include serotonin, an important neurotransmitter, and melatonin, a hormone involved in regulating the sleep-wake cycle. Tryptamine alkaloids found in fungi, plants and animals are sometimes used by humans for their psychotropic effects. Prominent examples include psilocybin (from "magic mushrooms") and DMT (from numerous plant sources, e.g. chacruna, often used in ayahuasca brews). Many synthetic tryptamines have also been made, including the migraine drug sumatriptan and its relatives. The tables below list some tryptamines.



General structure of substituted tryptamines

The tryptamine structure, in particular its indole ring, may be part of the structure of some more complex compounds, for example: LSD, ibogaine and yohimbine. A thorough investigation of dozens of tryptamine compounds was published by Ann and Alexander Shulgin under the title TiHKAL.



Stropharia rugosoannulata, commonly known as the **wine cap stropharia**, "garden giant", **burgundy mushroom** or **king stropharia** (Japanese: *saketsubatake*), is an agaric of the family Strophariaceae found in Europe and North America, and introduced to New Zealand.

Unlike many other members of the genus Stropharia, it is widely regarded as a choice edible and cultivated for food.

The king stropharia can grow to 20 cm high with a reddish-brown convex to flattening cap up to 30 cm across, the size leading to another colloquial name **godzilla mushroom**.^[] The gills are initially pale, then grey, and finally dark purple-brown in colour. The firm flesh is white, as is the tall stem which bears a wrinkled ring. This is the origin of the specific epithet which means "wrinkled-ringed".^[1]

It is found on wood chips and bark mulch across North America in summer and autumn. Described as very tasty by some authors, king stropharia is easily cultivated on a medium similar to what it grows on naturally. Antonio Carluccio recommends sautéeing them in butter or grilling them.^[]

In Paul Stamets' book *Mycelium Running*, a study done by Christiane Pischl showed that the king stropharia makes an excellent garden companion to corn. The fungus also has a European history of being grown with corn.

A 2006 study, published in the journal *Applied and Environmental Microbiology*, found the king stropharia to have the ability to attack the nematode *Panagrellus redivivus*; the fungus produces unique spiny cells called acanthocytes which are able to immobilise and digest the nematodes.^[2] See nematophagous fungus.
