Zaphiel (Zophiel, Iofiel, etc.)—a ruler of the order of cherubim, and prince of the planet Saturn. Zaphiel is also the preceptor angel of Noah. Milton (Paradise Lost VI, 535) calls Zaphiel (Zophiel) "of cherubim the swiftest wing." A "likeness" of Zophiel appears in Hayley, The Poetical Works of John Milton. According to Ambelain, La Kabbale Pratique, Zaphiel is also "chief of (the order of) thrones."
